Report UW/06/17 Re: Status Update of the UWSS Operations & Maintenance Activities and Capital Works to February 10, 2017, dated February 10, 2017

The Manager reviews his report with UWSS Board members. He notes the watermain break that occurred on February 9, 2017 at an old meter pit near the corner of Union Avenue and Road 2 East in Ruthven. He continues by stating that the meter pit is in poor condition and there had been discussion of perhaps abandoning the pit. However after discussions with OCWA staff and Town of Kingsville staff the Manager is suggesting that prices for rehabilitation be obtained so he can better determine the best course of action.

He informs members that OCWA staff have replaced valve and flow meters for filters #2 and #4. He explains to members that the valves were original to the plant and the task was difficult due to the tight working space.

Filter media replacement for Filters #5 and #7 should be completed within the next month. As well the new #1 Compressor has arrived.

The Town of Kingsville's inspection report has been received with a rating of 97.39%. The UWSS MOECC inspection started on January 26 with a new inspector looking at everything. The Manager notes that inspectors are changed approximately every three (3) years and each inspector has their own way of identifying any issues. The Manager will provide the latest UWSS inspection to Board members once received.

The Manager explains that flows are doing well this year, up over 2016.

The Manager then hands the floor over the Dale Dillen, Manager for OCWA, to go through the presentation for Capital and Operational projects from 2016. Members of the Board are able to see each project which includes the following (pictures were provided for as many projects as possible):

- Electrical projects such as meter replacements, lighting upgrades, security camera installs, zebra mussel control programming, fire prevention in the MCC Room and at the Low Lift, LWT pit panel and lighting, communication SOP updates, Rotork valve for clarifier #2, Low Lift Pump #2 soft start upgrade;
- Plant Improvements such as Chlorine Building receives a new roof liner and painting, maintenance shop receives a concrete pad, new pole barn roof

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installed, chemical cleaning of Filter #5, new mini lab, window replacements, pole barn oil tank and containment, AWT receives pipe insulation, pipe painting was completed on the raw water lines (extension of life), and microstrainer decommissioning;

- Operational Improvements such as guarding around pumps #6 and #7, new chlorine analyzers, zebra mussel control for Intake #2, upgrades to Powdered Activated Carbon (PAC) feed system, rebuild of High Lift Pump #3, rebuild of Low Lift Pump #3 and refurbish CBS pump #3, new actuator for raw water line #2, new turbidimeter replacement, pilot system flow monitoring device and repairs to Reservoir #2 (joint extension sealed);
- Miscellaneous work includes hatch repairs on intake #1 and solids removal.
- Distribution projects such as new flow meters in VC9, VC26, VC16, #11, #19 and #22, meter at Cull and Heritage in Kingsville removed, valve on Graham Sideroad replaced, maps updated on valve series, valve markers installed, new access ladder installed in Meter #6, new lid and ladder installed in Meter #3 and new portable trailer-mounted backup generator.

The Board asks the OCWA Operations Manager to explain what type of disaster would be necessary to stop the Ruthven WTP from producing water. The OCWA Operations Manager explains that not being able to produce water would be the greatest concern and algae could be an issue, which is why the UWSS Water Quality Masterplan has been undertaken.

Reports and Correspondence

Report UW/10/17 dated March 6, 2017 re: UWSS Water Quality Masterplan (WQMP) Study - Presentation of Results to the UWSS Board

The Manager reminds members of the board that the purpose of the meeting is to present the results of the Water Quality Masterplan (WQMP) Study that includes a complete review of the treatment process including coagulation, disinfection and all aspects of treated water. He indicates that project team members from the retained consultant, Associated Engineering (AE), will be presenting the report through a Powerpoint™ presentation. The Manager also indicates that he is not looking for any type of endorsement or approval at this time but rather the information is being presented to the Board for information purposes in regards to future capital treatment works planning. The Manager then introduces Vincent Laplante and Elia Edwards from AE.

Elia takes the lead on the presentation. He notes that the treatment plant master plan work that UWSS and OCWA operations staff are undertaking is great for the Board as a Page 8 of 28

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whole as it provides a better understanding of the assets and how to plan for the future. He confirms that other drinking water facilities, mostly in larger municipalities, are doing the same across Ontario. He indicates that there are three (3) technical memos to get through, but indicates that this is an open format and questions are welcome.

Technical Memo #1

Elia presents members of the Board with a summary of current and historical water quality data and identifies existing and future concerns, such as microbiological and other toxins. He provides the current rating for the UWSS facilities and shows a chart indicating a gap in the treatment plant's Clarification process. He notes that this seems to be the weakest part of the treatment process and suggests that there should be a focus area for investment/ upgrade.

The other areas of concern are microbial activity and the ability to treat for multiple types of microorganisms in the water and also states that the UWSS is below the guidelines for Geosmin, which is an indicator for taste and odor issues. He believes that continued monitoring is required for all processes. He also notes that the Ontario requirements for microbial treatment are lower than the USA EPA guidelines and Health Canada Guidelines and suggests UWSS look to those to guide future improvements for microbial disinfection.

There is a brief discussion regarding the level of barrier required in the industry regarding cryptosporidium. He notes that Ontario is only 2-log, while Canada is 3-log and USA is in the range of 2-5.5 log in the barrier approach. Elia notes that this project and the discussions today demonstrate to the MOE that the UWSS is taking reasonable steps to ensure the safety of our drinking water.

Elia also notes that UWSS is not operating at its rated capacity and whether that will change in the future is to be determined; the lower existing demand for water provides a buffer for the treatment capacity, which is good. He also indicates that future changes in the source water could potentially affect the way UWSS approaches treatment.

Technical Memo #2

Elia indicates that climate change could potentially affect the source water in the future but the actual range of such impact is currently unknown. He asks the question: Is it better to pay for changes to the system up front before climate changes affects are too great or is it better to wait until it is closer to the need? He asks the Board to consider this dilemma.

He then reviews the threats to water quality, the potential threats and the impacts on UWSS. Should additional funding to help source water be received from Federal, Provincial or local Government? He notes that the USA has made substantial cuts to their Great Lakes funding and yet millions of people share the source water. Therefore, how do we go forward to manage these risks?

The Manager reminds the Board members that UWSS has been involved with many source water/ algae monitoring programs and studies over the last several years to evaluate any of these risks to UWSS source water. The Board asks the Manager if letters

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should be drafted to our neighouring communities, including those in the USA, regarding the protection of our source water.

The Board then asks the Manager if funding should be set aside for improved lake intakes, such a deeper and further out into Lake Erie. The Manager indicates that currently UWSS has redundancy as the entire treatment plant can be fed on one intake if the other one should fail.

AE then explains the preliminary evaluation of treatment alternatives that was conducted as part of Technical Memo#2 in regards to Clarification, disinfection, and Taste &Odor/ Emerging Contaminants. They review water quality and treatment, operational considerations, environmental, public impact, design consideration, health and safety and cost. They then rated each issue for the UWSS and ranked them accordingly to determine a risk factor and which areas were considered weaker vs. stronger. The engineers ensured the Board members that this procedure was all done in conjunction with members of UWSS and OCWA staff.

Technical Memo #3

Elia indicates that if UWSS is to move forward with any new initiatives at the treatment plant all aspects must be looked at such as the site considerations, cost and size of footprint. Taste and odour will be continually monitored and they recommend getting a plan in place for to increase disinfection capabilities for cryptosporidium sooner rather than later. The other options could potentially be pushed out over ten (10) years.

The municipal staff present ask questions regarding pharmaceuticals in the water, as currently there is no plan in place to address this trending issue. The Manager states that there is no program in place for this particular issue, but future monitoring will be used to assess the treatment requirements for pharmaceuticals.

AE recommends some pre-treatment upgrades and pilot scale testing to better understand the raw water. They would like to determine if sediment Lake Erie water likes to float or sink, this data will then determine if UWSS should move over to dissolved air filtration (DAF) vs the conventional method currently in place.

There is a brief discussion regarding Ultraviolet (UV) technology and if this particular disinfection process would ever be beneficial at the Ruthven WTP. UV is being proposed for additional treatment of drinking water after it is filtered. This UV treatment would increase the UWSS' disinfection capacity from 2-log to 3-log for cryptosporidium. UV treatment equipment would be best placed within the reservoir for cost effective reasons.

The presentation then moves over to the possible costs involved in implementing any possible changes to the WTP. It should be noted that they present the material with a ten (10) year horizon.

There are some general discussions following the presentation regarding the financial aspect of the WQMP. The Manager notes that some of the ideas presented have been captured in his six (6) year capital plan, while others are beyond that specific horizon.

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There is a concern about possibly making a big switch regarding any one aspect of the water treatment process. The engineers explain that any changes would be completed in controlled states. There is a brief discussion regarding the current time line to complete some of the pilot and bench scale testing.

Reports and Correspondence

Report UW/10/17 dated March 21, 2017 re: UWSS Financial Report

The Manager begins by introducing the new Director of Finance for the Municipality of Leamington, Laura Rauch, and further explains that the UWSS auditor, Lindsay latonna, is also present for any questions.

Ms. Rauch then takes over and briefly introduces herself to members of the board. She then explains that the financial report for UWSS is prepared internally by the financial team at the Municipality of Leamington and audited by Ms. latonna.

She notes that revenue has increased slightly over previous years, most likely due to the hotter, drier summer experienced in 2016 and the increase in greenhouse production. Investment income is noted as exceeding budgetary expectations. This is in part due to the transfer from One Fund over to the WFCU investments.

Ms. Rauch moves on to the operating side of the report and explains that electricity prices exceeded the 2016 budget as a result of un-budgeted price increases in electrical rates; repairs and maintenance expenses in 2016 exceeded the budgetary numbers by

\$186,000 which is related to work completed that is not capital, such as the lagoon cleanout and drain and watermain maintenance, but was budgeted as capital.

Ms. Rauch notes that everything within the UWSS finances appears to be in order and the auditor has found no inconsistencies.

Councillor Patterson notes that Kingsville's financial team was also present in the audience and asks if Leamington required any extra assistance from the Kingsville staff in preparing the report or with the ongoing workload. Ms. Rauch indicates that there were no issues in handling the needs of UWSS through the Leamington staff, but thanks Kingsville for their offer.

Works to April 13, 2017



To inform the UWSS Board about operational and maintenance activities and capital works projects for the Union Water Supply System since the last Board meeting on.

Discussion:

The UWSS Manager conducts regular meeting with OCWA Operations staff in regards to on-going operations and maintenance programs for the UWSS facilities. The following provides an update on UWSS operations, regular maintenance and major maintenance and Capital Works at UWSS facilities:

- 1. Regular Maintenance on all process equipment and analyzers continue to be completed through OCWA's Workplace Maintenance Management System.
- 2. Filters #5 and #7 are scheduled for media replacement within the next few weeks. This work will be completed by Continental Carbon Group (CCG) of Stoney Creek, ON. CCG was also the supplier and installer of filter media for Filters #1-4. Upon removal of existing filter media by CCG, UWSS and OCWA maintenance staff will inspect the filter underdrains for damage. It is anticipated that the filter media replacement will be completed by mid-May 2017.
- 3. Compliance: The UWSS Final Inspection Report was issued by the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) on April 6, 2017. The UWSS was given an inspection rating of 95.01%. Details of the inspection are provided in report UW/13/17.
- 4. An inspection of Reservoir #1 has been scheduled for the month of May 2017. The inspection will be conducted while the reservoir is in operation. Inspectors will look for evidence of leakage, corrosion, and sediment accumulation.
- 5. The pilot study for the dissolved air flotation (DAF) pre-treatment system in currently under way. UWSS retained Associated Engineering (AE) to lead the pilot study. The DAF pilot system equipment, supplied by Roberts Filter Group of Media, Pennsylvania, arrived at the plant on April 10th, 2017. The DAF pilot system is slated to run for 3-4 weeks depending on conditions and results.

6. An additional turbidimeter has been purchased and installed to measure turbidity at intake #1. This will provide more accurate turbidity measurements while pump well #2 is not in use.

That the Union Water Supply System (UWSS) Board receives this report for information.

BACKGROUND

The UWSS is subject to annual inspections by the Ontario Ministry of Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) under the Safe Drinking Water Act, 2002 (SDWA) and its associated regulations.

The UWSS was inspected on January 26, 2017 and the final report for that inspection was issued by the MOECC on April 6, 2017. The previous inspection was conducted on January 14, 2016.

DISCUSSION:

The April 6, 2017 inspection report identifies one (1) item under the report section titled *Non-Compliance with Regulatory Requirements and Actions Required.* This item was identified by the inspector as an item of non-compliance with the SDWA for the inspection period and provides the required actions to be undertaken by UWSS. Details regarding the non-compliance are provided on Pages 15 of the Final Inspection Report (attached).

The inspection report also includes a section titled *Summary of Recommendations and Best Practice Issues*, found on pages 16 of the Final Inspection Report. No recommended actions or best practices issue were identified in the Final Inspection Report.

It should be noted that the identified non-compliance was addressed appropriately at the time of occurrence. All necessary follow up required actions will be completed and reported to the MOECC drinking water inspector prior to the imposed May 1st, 2017 deadline.

As required by the regulations under the SDWA, the municipal water systems which receive drinking water from the UWSS have been provided with copies of the inspection
