Reports and Correspondence

Report UW/25/17 Re: Status Update of the UWSS Operations & Maintenance Activities and Capital Works to September 15, 2017 and dated September 15, 2017

The Manager notes that during the regular UWSS Board meetings, OCWA operations staff including the Senior Operations Manager - Dale Dillen and Process and Compliance Technician - Ken Penney are often present and they assist the Manager by providing any operational details that may be asked by Board members. The Manager further notes that additional OCWA management staff are present for this meeting including the OCWA CEO/President - Nevin McKeown, Vice President of Operations - Terry Bender, Business Development Officer - Susan Budden, and Essex Regional Manager - Dave Jubenville.

The Manager then proceeds with his report. He informs members of the UWSS Board that the cleaning of the south settling pond has been completed by DiMenna Excavating. He further explains that DiMenna Excavating was the low bid on the project. He confirms that the jobs was completed quickly and efficiently.

The new Low Lift Pump #2 has arrived and should be installed in early October. Meter #14 has been upgraded with electrical service, as it was previously battery powered. Now this meter pit has a sump pump and flooding issues should be resolved. His hope is to start receiving flow information. He confirms that Meters #6 and #5 should have repairs completed by September 27th. Once this work is complete the meters will be working together to provide flow information throughout the system.

The Manager also confirms that the new lighting of the Leamington Water Tower bowl has been installed. Several members of the Board confirm that the lighting is pleasing to the eye and not overwhelming. He also indicates that an air conditioner was installed in the equipment building at the Leamington Tower in order to prevent overheating of electrical panels.

The Manager then informs the Board of the change in coagulant that has taken place over the last several weeks. He indicates that our testing was showing an increased aluminum residual and therefore operators changed over to an aluminum chlorohydrate (ACH) coagulant, Hyperion 1090, in order to reduce the plant effluent aluminum residual. He confirms that this is a temporary switch and that the MOECC has been notified of the temporary switch in coagulant. He further reminds members that UWSS has retained Associated Engineering to complete a preliminary design study for the CO2 pH adjustment system that would address the high raw water pH issue, which is creating the high aluminum residuals problem. There is a small discussion regarding home dialysis and the need for the switch.

The Manager states that he is awaiting receipt of the final draft for the SCADA RFP from Associated Engineering. He does expect to receive it sometime later in the week. He is hoping to have the RFP released to pre-selected SCADA integrators by the 2nd week of October and award the contract by the end of November.

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Flows are then reviewed for the year. The Manager indicates that they are slightly down over last year and up over the previous four (4) year average, and that they are above the budget set for the 2017 year.

The Board asks the Manager why the aluminum residual is so high this year and is there worry for health effects. The Manager is not sure as to why the problem is occurring this year. It appears related to source water. He has spoken to other colleagues in various water systems and it appears that many are dealing with similar issues. The Manager also notes that this issue could be related to the polyaluminum chloride or just another factor in the lake at the moment. He confirms that when pH is adjusted the levels do come down substantially.

Report UW/26/17 Re: Essex Water Tower Rehabilitation Tender Results dated September 14, 2017

The Manager reviews his report with the Board. He confirms that with the assistance of OCWA Engineering staff the RFP process has worked well. He notes that Landmark had performed two (2) inspections on the Essex Water Tower (EWT); one in 2013 and again in 2015. A few safety issues were noted at the time and will be addressed, along with a few items that the Ministry of Labour has also discovered.

The Manager explained that seven (7) firms were invited to place a bid, however, only four (4) bids were received at the time of deadline. The Manager explains that contractors are very busy at this time and EWT is far away for a lot of contractors. He confirms that the low bid received was from JDCMI, which is the same company that completed the LWT rehabilitation. The JDCMI bid was just over the approved budget for the EWT work.

The Manager then explains that because it is getting late in the year and the weather could turn at any moment, it is felt by OCWA, JDCMI and himself that it will be a more suitable situation to wait until the warmer weather of Spring 2018 to commence this project. If UWSS Board decides to wait then JDCMI will provide UWSS with a credit, which in turn brings the project budget within what has previously been approved.

There is a brief discussion regarding the credit received. The Manager explains that it was all part of the tender process. He had noted that there was a possibility of waiting until the Spring.

September 20, 2017 UWSS Joint Board of Management Meeting Minutes

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There is a brief discussion regarding the durability of the rehabilitation. The Manager feels that this process should allow the EWT to have another 15-20 years of life. There is then a small discussion regarding which logos will be placed on the tower. The Manager indicates the process will be similar to that of the LWT.

Works to October 13, 2017



To inform the UWSS Board about operational and maintenance activities and capital works projects for the Union Water Supply System since the last Board meeting on September 20th, 2017.

Discussion:

The UWSS Manager conducts regular meeting with OCWA Operations staff in regards to on-going operations and maintenance programs for the UWSS facilities. The following provides an update on UWSS operations, regular maintenance and major maintenance and Capital Works at UWSS facilities:

- 1. Regular Maintenance on all process equipment and analyzers continue to be completed through OCWA's Workplace Maintenance Management System.
- 2. The new Low lift pump #2 purchased from ASL Roteq has been received. Existing low lift pump #2 will be removed during the week of October 16th, 2017. The new pump will be installed during the week of October 23rd, 2017.
- Billing Meter #8 has been upgraded to a new magnetic flow meter that includes communication capabilities. The new meter was installed, disinfected and commissioned on September 28th, 2016.
- 4. Billing Meter #27 is scheduled for replacement by the end of October 2017. The existing meter will be replacement with a new state of the art magnetic flow meter with communication capabilities.
- 5. The temporary change in coagulant from the poly aluminum chloride (PACL) coagulant DelPAC 2020 to the Aluminum Chlorohydrate (ACH) coagulant, Hyperion 1090 is still in place. The aluminum residuals in treated water has been below the guideline of 0.1 mg/l since September 26th, 2017. It is anticipated that the temporary change of coagulants will be terminated in early November as the Lake Erie water temperature cools, algae dissipates and pH returns to a lower level.
- 6. An Adverse Water Quality Incident (AWQI) was issued on October 10th, 2017 due to a malfunctioning coagulant pump. The pump failed to pump coagulant

for approximately an hour. The faulty pump was replaced with a spare pump. An AWQI resolution was issued that same day. There were no adverse effects to water quality from this incident.

- 7. The Request for Proposal Document (RFP) for SCADA System Upgrade, prepared by Associated Engineering, has been reviewed and approved for finalization by the UWSS General Manager. The RFP is scheduled for release on October 20th, 2017. The RFP will only be provided to a pre-selected list of SCADA integrators. The RFP will be closed on November 20th, 2017.
- Associated Engineering has prepared a Preliminary Design report for the CO2 raw water pH adjustment system. The report was provided to UWSS on October 6th, 2017 and is currently under review by UWSS General Manager and contracted OCWA Operations staff.

To present the Chief Drinking Water Inspections (CDWI) Report for 2016 - 2017 and the Minister's Annual Report on Drinking Water 2016.

BACKGROUND:

The Safe Drinking Water Act Inspector is required under Section 7 (2) to issue an Annual Report in respect of the overall performance of Ontario's drinking water system.

The Minister's Annual Report on Drinking Water 2016 includes an overview of Ontario's drinking water systems' performance.

DISCUSSION:

Chief Drinking Water Inspector's (CDWI) Report

The CDWI Report gives an overview of Ontario's drinking water regulatory system. The Report shows an increase in the inspector ratings for municipal drinking water systems since 2005.

The Report aggregates all of the bacteriological tests across the province to obtain a figure of 99.84% of tests meeting standards; and that 99.4% of municipal water inspections had ratings higher than 80% and 70% received perfect scores. This number is approximately the same as in the last year's report. Appendix 1 contains the inspection ratings for each municipal drinking water system in Ontario. The UWSS and the four municipal systems it supplies are listed on in the Appendix 1: Essex - 98.75%, Kingsville - 97.39%, Lakeshore - 100% and Leamington - 98.80%. Appendix 1 also provides information regarding testing results for each system and the percentage of tests meeting Ontario's drinking water standards are listed. All four municipalities received 100% of the tests meeting standards.

This report also updates the public on Ontario's safety net when it comes to drinking water, such as the many of the changes in the legislative and regulatory framework; health-based standards for drinking water; regular and reliable testing for drinking water; strong action on Adverse Water Quality Incidents (AWQI); mandatory licensing/operator certification; multifaceted compliance improvement; and public engagement. The CDWI noted the progress made in the area of Source Water Protection, namely that all locally developed source protection plans have been received and are currently under review.

The Minister's Annual Report on Drinking Water 2016

This report provides and overview of Ontario's drinking water systems' performance. This reports also includes information regarding climate change and the work being done to protect the Great Lakes as well as improving First Nations drinking water supplies. This report also includes information on the work being done to protect source water and any emerging issues that are effecting Ontario's drinking water.

The Minister's Annual Report 2016 touches on inspection results, compliance and enforcement activities training and certification and summarizes the work being done to reduce carbon output for Ontario.

A copy of the Minister's Annual Report 2016 has been provided electronically to each UWSS Board member, to the clerks of each municipality, and also posted on the UWSS website.
